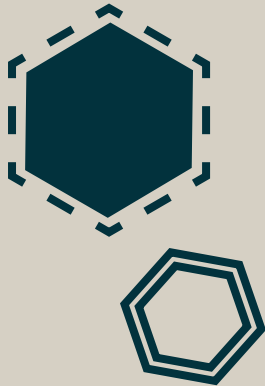

CAREERS AND EMPLOYABILITY SUPPORT



The University's Careers and Enterprise team is here to help you make the most of your skills and experience, preparing you for the next stage of your career. We provide information, advice and support to help you explore your future career options, including information on setting up your own business and working for yourself, as well as helping you to evidence your employability to potential employers.

We offer opportunities to meet employers through events such as careers fairs and can also help you to find job vacancies and enhance your interview skills. Our team provides a range of online resources, workshops and 1:1 appointments to help you explore your future career path and develop your employability.

You might have heard the word 'employability' being used when people are talking about graduate jobs. But what is it? Employability is all about what skills you have and how you can demonstrate to employers that you have these skills.

Much of the ordinary, everyday activity that you undertake as a student can contribute to your employability development, e.g. working in groups, planning projects, undertaking part-time work and giving presentations.

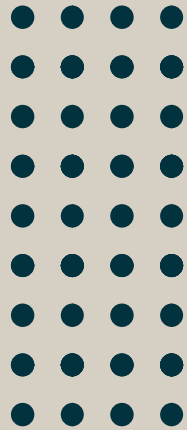
/ Finding a job and a work placement

Use our online vacancy service to search for graduate roles advertised by employers working directly with the University.

As well as specialist technical skills that are usually related to very specific occupations (e.g. C++ programming in IT jobs or different types of engineering jobs), a lot of employability skills are soft skills (e.g. communication or problem solving), which are the ones that enable you to become more effective in your day-to-day working role, and which you will keep developing throughout your working life.

Employers expect candidates to offer more than a good academic record and degree. They also look for work experience (relevant if possible) and evidence of employability skills such as teamwork, organisation and creativity. Employers also look for rounded individuals – they want evidence that you have developed your skills outside of your studies, through involvement in clubs and societies or through part-time jobs and voluntary work.





OPPORTUNITIES TO ENGAGE WITH EMPLOYERS

We provide lots of opportunities to build relationships with employers to be inspired by them and learn about their employment opportunities. Whether this be through drop-ins at the Careers Hub or Library Foyer, employability events organised by the team such as Careers Fairs, and the opportunity to apply for internship programmes with employers.



Santander Internship Case Study Bukola Fadahunsi

MSc Digital Marketing.

Internships provide opportunities to gain great work experience, develop employability skills and explore future possible careers options. Bukola's story demonstrates how beneficial internship experiences can be.

Bukola's internship was with Manchester based social marketing agency Social Sense, who deliver positive social behavioural change and ensure measurable results for communities throughout the UK and Europe.

Bukola was supporting a project that aims to measure the lived experience of those affected by dementia. The role involved reviewing the current online content for the project and creating new content, alongside supporting the writing of proposals, bids and creating presentations.

Bukola commented: "The internship has provided the opportunity for me to develop lots of different skills like communication, collaboration and creativity. Working within a smaller business exposed me to lots of different tasks that I might not otherwise have had the chance to experience. It was great being able to apply what I was learning at the University of Salford to my role in industry."

The benefits to business from providing internships include bringing fresh perspectives, new ideas and support for critical projects. Gary Lovatt, Managing Director at Social Sense commented:

"Bukola was an absolute pleasure to work with. She is knowledgeable, hardworking and adaptable which are all the requirements needed when working in a small company with changing challenges. We learned from each other and overall the experience was a very positive one".

Careers Fairs

Careers Fairs are a great chance for you to start to talk to employers in order to find out more about them, ask how they recruit to their business, build up your contacts, and possibly be invited to complete an application form in order to be considered to work for them after your studies. Careers Fairs are also the time to make a good first impression to potential employers or lead you to a future employment/work experience opportunity.

The majority of Careers Fairs run in the Autumn, with the Spring Careers Fair taking place in March.

Azeem Amir

Business Management with Sport

As well as studying for his degree, Azeem, from Rochdale, is a qualified sport and football coach and plays blind football professionally around the world with England. He has been blind since birth and uses his passion for sport as a tool to inspire and engage young people. He has made the most of the opportunities and support available from the Careers and Enterprise team at Salford to start his own business, Learn with ESS.

Learn with ESS is an initiative that uses Education, Sport and Speaking (ESS) based activities to provide a unique and interactive team experience whilst addressing stigmatised issues surrounding disability. Azeem first heard of the Enterprise team in 2017, when they attended his first-year induction talk at Salford Business School. He then attended events such as the Business Careers Fair and it was there he spoke to the team about starting his own business. In 2019 he set up Learn with ESS after being accepted onto the Launch@Salforduni training programme, as well as attending a range of masterclasses and the Start-Up School. He was also awarded a £2,000 Santander Start-up Grant based on successfully completing Launch training and growing his business.

With the help of the Launch business incubator, Azeem developed a workshop which incorporates classroom-based activities on learning, visual and hearing impairment awareness, and a practical

Paralympic taster session on sports such as blind football and goalball, and a motivational talk from a local role model or athlete.

Azeem and his team started successfully piloting his business in March 2020 in local schools and colleges, and over the last year more than 20 schools, football clubs and businesses nationally have benefitted from his virtual programme, with several schools now signed up to his face-to-face workshops. He has also partnered with the National Citizen Service to introduce his programme into English Football League Clubs and community trusts including Blackburn Rovers, Oldham Athletic, Preston North-End, Salford City FC and Rochdale AFC, and is even in talks with the Football Association to expand his workshops internationally.

Azeem says:

“Launch incubator has given me the opportunity to develop a basic idea that I was very passionate about, into a fully registered trading business with a strong business plan, a legal structure, market strategy and cost budget analysis. The staff and the kick-starter business growth hub programmes have given me the tools I need along with the guidance to develop my idea and allowed me to see the success of my hard work.”

ENHANCE YOUR EMPLOYABILITY WITH SALFORD SU

Salford SU is the representative body for all students at the University of Salford. We work in partnership with the University and other stakeholders to ensure that all students love their life at Salford.

We're led by five Student Officers who are elected from our membership each year. We support over 500 student course representatives and provide professional advice to around 2,000 students each year.

The Students' Union also encompasses championship winning sports teams, over 50 student societies, events drawing thousands of students, campaigns, as well as a café, a bar, and a nightclub.

INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

More students than ever understand the importance of international experience and employers are increasingly interested in students who have global awareness.

Students who take part in our International Opportunities programmes reap the academic, professional and personal benefits of an international experience for future employment in the UK and overseas.

We expect the majority of students to achieve a 2:1 degree or above on graduation. This expectation is based on 2021-22 University of Salford data, which shows that 83.6% of all mobility students achieved a 2:1 and above, compared to 75.6% for those who didn't participate in mobility; and 54.8% of all mobility students achieved First Class degrees, compared to 35.4% for non-mobile students.

Studying or working abroad, plus international activities at home in class or through events run by the University, give you the opportunity to see more of the world, understand the global environment and experience a different style of education (if studying at a partner university). You may also be able to learn a new language and get to know another culture. It's a fantastic opportunity for you to develop yourself both personally and professionally, while making new friends from across the globe and acquiring skills that are attractive to potential employers.

At Salford, we are here to help you make this happen, with our range of global study exchange programmes and short-term opportunities, as well as a programme of virtual activities and events for all students to get involved in and benefit from a global education. Depending on your programme, you may also be eligible for funded work placements.

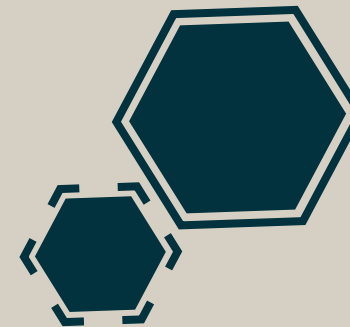

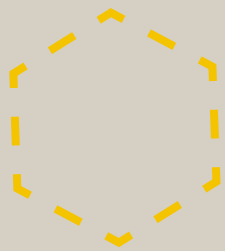
